Ms. Margaret's Pre-School

Ms. Margaret's Class began learning about the letter I this week. Also this week, the children will freeze water and observe the changes it goes through when it becomes ice. They will graph their prediction about water, when frozen, does it take up more space, less space or stay the same amount of space. The children will compare the bells in each estimation jar and say which one has the most bells and the least bells. They will also look at the bells lined up and say which is the longest, middle and shortest in length.

Some of the stories the children listened to this week are How Santa Got His Job by Stephen Krensky, How Santa Lost His Job By Stephen Krensky, and Room for a Little One by Martin Waddell.

Ms. Nancy's Pre-Kindergarten

This week we read the book <u>The Littlest Angel.</u> It was a very sweet story and the children loved it. We also made angels after we read the book and completed a writing assignment called, If I were an angel, I would.....

Today, we worked in our science journals. We did an experiment about water, ice, and snow. the students loved observing bottles of water that we froze. They were amazed to learn that the same water we just froze turned back into water. In reading, the students are enjoying learning about the letter I. We made ice cream cones out of construction paper and even had ice cream for a special treat on Wednesday.

Ms. Kim's Kindergarten

This weekend the second graders made their First Reconciliation. They did a great job! The second graders are now learning more about Advent and Christmas. The kindergarteners are working on their Superkid book, Lily, and the letter L. They are also working on recognizing the names of the Superkids and how to spell these names as well as decoding other CVC (consonant, vowel, consonant) words. In math the students are working on comparing numbers through 10.

Mrs. Sibick's Multi-age Classroom

First graders have been applying spelling patterns and tricks when they encode (spell). This week they are learning how to spell words with ed and ing endings. They use a trick to remember when to double the consonant, or when to only add the ending. If the word has one consonant after the vowel, students double the consonant and add the ending. If the word has two consonants after the vowel, they only add the ending. The stories this week were The Monster Under the Bus and Yuck! Yuck! Second grade finished reading the second Super Magazine. The theme was tricky. The magazine discussed paintings that fooled your eyes because of the 3 dimensions and animals that tricked predators for survival. The next chapter book is Henry and Mudge. Students are applying math concepts in Chapter 4. They are learning how to subtract by thinking of the related addition fact. It is another way to find the solution and the math series encourages multiple approaches to arrive at the correct answer. Second graders are working on using base ten blocks to identify how many tens and ones a number has. In Science the students are discussing ways to stay healthy. Students came up with eating healthy and exercising. They even got to watch Sid the Science Kid clip on eating cake. It has songs and clips of kids learning about healthy eating. In Social Studies, students are learning about Statue of Liberty. Have a great week!
