# Ms. Margaret's Pre-School

This week in the 3-year-olds preschool class, the children worked on the letter Nn and continue to work on identifying the letters in their name.

The stories this week were Rosie Rabbit's Valentine's Day by Harriet Ziefert, Arthur's Valentine by Marc Brown, and Don't Be my Valentine by Joan Lexau.

For Science the children discussed zoos, discuss what to do in an emergency, and make predictions.

In math, the children sorted hearts by size, played Valentine Bingo, and matched number symbols, words and quantities.

#### Mrs. Sibick's Multi-age Classroom

This week the students decorated their shoe boxes with fun foam, stickers, anddrawings for Valentine's Day. The class did a great job! They had fun reading the names as they delivered mail to the valentine boxes. The first graders have been reading a story called The Contest. They are practicing reading with expression. Ask your child which character he/she would like to be. They are also working on spelling words with two vowels (ee, ea, keep, deep, meat, beat, etc.). Second graders are working on the cursive c and a this week. Students are working on their fluency (reading smoothly) with short stories from their decodable reader. Ask about the story Mystery Kid. First grade completed Chapter 7 on skip counting and word problems. Second grade is using a paper and pencil to subtract two-digit numbers with regrouping. First graders are reviewing Jesus's birth. Kindergarten students listened to a story about Zachaeus making better choices. Maddie presented her science experiment this week. Ask your child what they learned about the three balloons.
