We need the forms to be returned for both setting tuition for the coming year, as well as classroom planning. Without the forms we run the risk of having to raise the tuition, which is something we are hoping NOT to do. These forms with registration fee must be returned NO LATER than Wednesday, January 25. If your registration form and payment are not returned by Wednesday, the office will assume your child will be returning for the 2012-2013 school year.

Year-round Pre-school Option

Possibly beginning this summer, we are looking to open a year-round pre-school program. The hours, curriculum, etc. will remain the same during the summer months. Our current school year would be extended by nine weeks, and we would have three weeks off in August, as we need to get ready for the new school year. An additional cost of about \$1,000 would be added onto the current tuition for the extension of the school year. We will be offering the same day schedule, either five full days, five half days, or three full days. We will need at least 10 students to run the program. Ms. Margaret's Pre-School

This week in the 3-year-olds preschool class, the children began working on the letter LI. The stories this week are Snow on Snow on Snow by Cheryl Chapman, Polar Bear in Danger by Helen Orme, Welcome to the Ice House by Jane Yolen, and Puffins Climb Penguins Rhyme by Bruce McMillan. For Science the children will discuss the qualities of snow, how they are different from and similar to polar bears and they animals that live in the Artic. In math the children will review numbers 1 to 8, put them in order from 1 to 8, and

This week students echo read a story in our Superkids book called, "Tag". They also played a game called Tic, Tac, Toc, it is played similar to Tic Tac Toe. Make sure to ask your child about the story "Tac, Toc, and Turtles," that ended our current Superkids book. We will be starting our next Superkids book, Frits. The kindergarteners also used a number line to help answer number riddles, such as "If you start on 15 and move two forward, you land on me. What number am I?" The students did an excellent job finding the answers. The second graders are learning about the parts of the Liturgy of the Word and looked at the Nicene Creed to find what we believe in as Catholics.

Mrs. Sibick's Multi-age Classroom

The students started off the week revisiting our Snowfall Predictions Bar Graph. On Friday, every student predicted how many inches of snow would fall. The National Weather Service recorded O'hare had 5. 4 inches. Numerous students guessed 5 or 6 inches. First graders are busy reading stories to each other and the kindergarten students. They even created a flip book to identify the beginning, middle, and end to a story. Second grade students are learning how to write h and I in cursive this week. In the SUPER magazine, they learned about the Festival of Lights in Thailand. First grade students are practicing subtraction with counters (circles that are red on one side and yellow on the other). Second graders are using tens and ones to carry a ten over or regroup. Students understand to carry the one over in math problems (17 + 8 = 25). I am very proud of the students' ability to grasp difficult concepts so quickly. In Religion, the kindergarten students are learning to recite The Lord's Prayer. The first graders are learning how God gave us the greatest gift of all, his son. This Wednesday Christina presented her science experiment. We enjoyed it! Have a great week!
