# Check out what's happening in our classrooms...

#### Ms. Margaret's Pre-School

This week in Ms. Margaret's class the children are learning that God giving them families to love and care for them.

The children painted the letter  $C_{i}$ introduced to lower case c, cut and pasted Cathy the letter C and colored a large lower case c. They were introduced to upper case D and were able to take a walk on a large D on the floor. The children enjoyed listening to The Pumpkin Patch by Elizabeth King, Pumpkin Pumpkin by Jeanne Titherington, From Seed to Pumpkin by Jan Kottke, and Pumpkin Soup by Helen Cooper. The children measured our class pumpkin and themselves. Then we compared the measurements to find out if the pumpkin's tummy was longer or shorter than the children's tummy.

#### Ms. Nancy's Pre-Kindergarten

This week we went on a nature walk. The children and I were very excited because we saw a praying mantis crawling in the grass. When we returned to our room, we looked a praying mantis up on the computer and talked about this interesting insect.

We started writing our first name this week and I am pleasantly surprised by the effort the children put into it. I will be sending home some sheets in the next couple of days so that you can see for yourself.

We only touched on the life cycle of a pumpkin. Next week, we will dive right into it. I have some interesting things we can do with this awesome science activity. #### Ms. Kim's Kindergarten

This week the kindergarteners finished our Oswald book and we will be starting our next Superkids book. The kids can't wait to find out who is next. In math we made Counting Octopuses. The students matched up the numeral with the number word and then drew circles to match the number. They turned out great and the kids had a lot of fun making them.

#### Mrs. Sibick's Multi-age Classroom

Students are enjoying our new math series (Envision). First graders are learning how two parts (addends) equal a whole (or the sum). Second graders have reviewed addition and begun subtraction. In Religion, the kindergarten students learned how Jesus told the children to come to him. The first graders learned ways we can praise God for all he created. Also, the first graders are reading more stories from their decodable reader! Reading is hard work and they are doing great! Second graders are finishing up the last article in the magazine, *Super*. Then, second graders will read <u>Frog and Toad Together</u>. In Science, Angelica was the Scientist of the week! She taught the class about black lights and what causes things to glow in the dark. Each student got glow sticks to take home.
