

## Ms. Margaret's Pre-School

This week in Ms. Margaret's class the children are learning about Jesus as the Shepard and that he cares for his sheep.

The children walked on the capital letter C, on the floor, in the classroom, cut and glue paper to a capital letter C, worked together on coloring a large capital letter C, and used play dough to form the capital letter C.

They enjoyed listening to More Parts by Tedd Arnold,
Goldilocks and the Three Bears by Valeri Gorgachev, Just Like Daddy by Frank Asch, and Copy Me,
Copycub by Richard Edwards.

They are able to observe green leaves by going to our Science Center and through our windows.

They are enjoying arranging chairs, porridge and beds by size, smallest to largest or largest to smallest.

#### Ms. Nancy's Pre-Kindergarten

Happy October! This week we listened to the poem *The Five Little Pumpkins* and the class made five pumpkins on a fence. In science, we explored a pumpkin. The children had a lot of fun putting their hands in the pumpkin and exploring. In math; we counted pumpkins. We also started working on patterns. The children used pumpkins to make patterns.

We measured how tall we were by pumpkins. It was a fun activity for the student's. The class also went on a nature walk on Thursday. We collected leaves for an activity in class. It was a beautiful day for a walk.

On Monday, we started the story <u>The Three Little Bears</u> in the Rowland Rading Program. We talked about words like big, medium, hot, cottage, porridge, and bear. Looking ahead...

We will begin to write our first name. We will also be working on matching. We will start learning about the life cycle of a pumpkin. In religion, we will be reading the story The Tower of Babel *Genesis 11:1-9*. As a class, we will be making our own towers.

The students enjoyed visiting Safety Town. They had a catchy song to tell kids what to do if they find a gun. (stop- don't touch- leave the area- tell an adult) Eddie the Eagle sang the song on a DVD. The students practiced exiting a trailer home full of fake smoke. They also learned how to cross streets safely. They even got a nice goodie bag from it. Students are using the language experience approach in writing. Basically students write about things they experience, so they have more background knowledge and an emotional connection. The class wrote about our trip to Safety Town. We have begun a unit on farms. First graders read their first story in their reader! It was called, <u>Patch in a Pinch.</u> Please ask your child about it.
