

#### Ms. Margaret's Pre-School

This week in Ms. Margaret's Preschool Class we "walked" the the letter A, practiced our Gloria prayer, and made observations of the inside of an apple. We even painted the letter A. We had a lot of fun learning!

#### Ms. Nancy's Pre-Kindergarten

Last week we made applesauce with apples. The children loved mixing apples in a large bowl. They were amazed when I served it for snack. Yummy! We also talked about Jesus and his friends. We read a bible story about Adam and Eve and the children had many guestions about why Adam and Eve did not listen to God. One student asked me if it was okay if he ate apples. © We also learned about whole and half in math. I cut an apple in half and then put it together to show the children the difference. The children than cut a paper apple in half and put it back together again to show the difference between half and whole. Look in your child's folder for the apple and have them show you what they have learned.

Fall is here! We are making leaf boys and girls in art. In science, we will be talking about the color of our eyes. In math, we will be sorting and counting leaves.

First graders are learning how we are part of the Catholic Community. Kindergarten students listened to the story about Noah and the ark. They discussed how the rainbow reminds us that God always cares for us.
